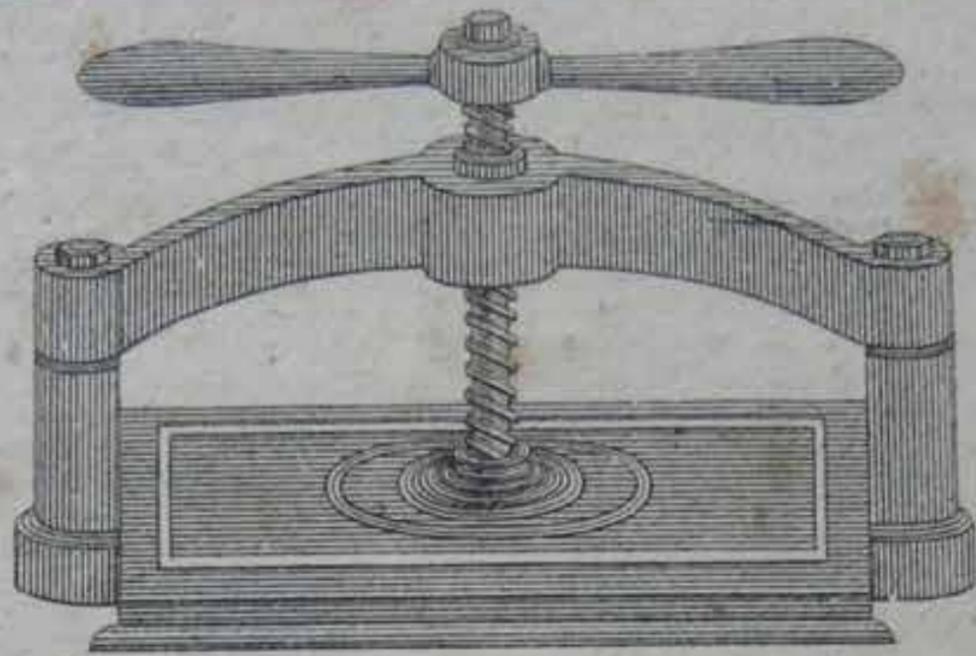

## RULES.

1. The name of this school shall be "The Geelong College, in connection with the Presbyterian Church of Victoria."
2. The object of the College shall be to impart a First-class Education, so as to prepare its pupils for mercantile pursuits, and for entering the University.
3. Boys of all religious denominations shall be admitted to the College. The Bible and the Westminster Assembly's Catechism shall form the basis of the religious instruction, but attendance on such religious instruction shall not be compulsory.
4. The College shall be under the management of a Committee of Twelve Gentlemen in connection with the Presbyterian Church of Victoria, three to form a quorum. With this Committee shall rest the appointment of the Principal, and the confirmation of the appointment of the other Masters.
5. Of this Committee nine members shall be appointed annually by the subscribers, and three by the Presbytery of Geelong.
6. Twelve Gentlemen shall also be elected annually by the subscribers as corresponding members of Committee.
7. The scale of Fees shall be regulated by the Committee of Management.
8. Scholarships, to be held by distinguished pupils during their attendance at the University, shall be founded as soon as practicable.
9. An Annual Meeting of the subscribers shall be held in the month of June, when a Report for the previous Twelve Months shall be submitted, which report shall also be laid on the table of the general assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria at their Annual Meeting.
10. Every subscriber of one Guinea annually, shall be entitled to one vote; of five Guineas to two votes; and of ten Guineas or upwards to three votes, provided such subscription has been paid at least one month previous to the Annual Meeting.
11. No change shall be made upon these rules, without the consent of two-thirds of the subscribers present at the Annual Meeting—notice of such alteration to be publicly advertised once, at least, one week before such Meeting, but the First and Third Rules, being fundamental, are hereby declared unalterable.

The Second Annual Report of the  
 Geelong College June 1863

Since the first Annual Meeting of the  
 subscribers to the Geelong College on the 30 June  
 1862 the Committee then appointed have held  
 twelve Meetings, at several of them much con-  
 sideration was given to the necessity for the  
 immediate erection of suitable Buildings, as  
 the very great success that has attended the  
 progress of the College rendered the present Buildings  
 quite inadequate for the proper accommodation of  
 the boarders and the proper classification of  
 the students. Schemes were adopted for the  
 raising of funds for the purpose of their erections  
 which has been attended, so far as prosecuted,  
 with encouraging success.

The great difficulties that have presented  
 themselves have arisen about a proper site  
 the Committee have had their attention called to  
 several considered suitable and after much  
 time having been consumed negotiating about  
 these nothing definite was done, either from  
 the circumstance of the owners being absent  
 from the Colony, or the price asked being  
 considered by the Committee far too high.

Lately the Committee agreed to apply to  
 the Government for the Grant of an eligible

site but after a delay of two or three months an answer of a negative character has been received, so that the Committee are now under the impression that an immediate request should be forwarded to the President of the Board of Land & Survey to put up the piece of Land for Public Sale so that if the College Committee become the purchasers then the Government would be in a position to convey the Ground by proper titles to the College.

The number of pupils at the College have, under the care and assiduous attention of Geo Morrison Esq M.A. the Principal gradually and steadily increased and again several of the advanced students have carried honors at the University in Melbourne.

The numbers now under his charge are Resident Boarders Day Boarders and students and of all of whom it may be said the progress they are making in the various branches of their studies proves the careful training they undergo.
